The polar bears living far from home

Although polar bears belong in the frozen Arctic, they have long been kept in captivity far from home. In the 20th Century, screaming crowds admired them in city zoos, and 800 years ago, King Henry III even housed one in the Tower of London.

By the 1990s, though, campaigners were insisting that they could not be happy in small enclosures, thousands of miles from their natural home. By 2000, just one polar bear remained in Britain.

Now, the polar bears are back. In the last year, Jimmy's Farm, the wildlife park run by TV presenter Jimmy Doherty, has taken in four. A further 12 bears live in three other British parks.

Doherty says that his mission is to champion conservation, farming and rewilding, and reconnect children with nature. His first polar bears came from Sweden in 2022. He built a large enclosure, including a pool, two dens and a large woodland area, for them to live in.

But can an Arctic species really cope with sunny Suffolk? "If they want to regulate their temperature they can go in the woodland," Doherty explains.

The enclosures at Jimmy's Farm are much larger than traditional zoo pens. For critics, however, they are still a much smaller space than polar bears enjoy in the world.

The Born Free Foundation, a charity, insists that no polar bears should be kept in captivity. "There's no meaningful or direct conservation benefit to keeping polar bears in captivity," says Chris Lewis.

Bringing polar bears to Jimmy's Farm was clearly a decision of the heart for Doherty — but he had his financial head on too. They had a 50% increase in visitors over summer half-term.

One expert, Douglas Richardson, predicts that global heating will lead to more climate change refugee polar bears requiring rescue. He hopes that new, massive fenced reserves similar to polar bears' natural habitat may be established, just as many African safari animals live in fenced reserves.

Meanwhile, Doherty does not rule out breeding polar bears... but only if "we need more paws on the ground".
