BUILD YOUR KNOWLEDGE

Many British bird species have had a hard time since the 1970s, mostly because of changes in the way we use farmland. Fewer hedges means less space for birds to feed and nest, for example. But you can find 628 different species in the UK if you keep looking!

n ornithologist shared her tips for keeping birds chirpy in your garden with The Day.

Nature nerd

Lara Nouri knows a thing or two about birds. For years, this self-confessed "nature nerd" has studied our feathered friends. When she's not photographing birds, Lara can be found "ringing" them — tracking a bird's movements by safely wrapping a little ring around its leg to identify it.

Building for birds

Surveying birds has helped her to learn what we can do to keep the birds around, too. Action to help birds can start in your garden, or a local park.

"Gardens make up a huge proportion of our land in the UK", she says. "Even a tiny garden, if managed for wildlife, can really see an increase in biodiversity.

Nesting instinct

If you're looking for birds, keep an eye out for insects. Most birds feed on them.

and so anywhere that insects can live is good for birds.

"You may see wrens doing the same route over and over", she says, as they hunt for spiders, a bit like a "little commute".

Berries are great for blackbirds and thrushes. And in winter, you might see redwings looking for the last few berries on a bush. Any kind of water can help too.

"It's really important to try and get as much diversity in your garden as possible.
