Eco-home owners 'live green or lose it'

BUILD YOUR KNOWLEDGE

In 2012, Wales launched a new One Planet Development policy that requires new homes in protected areas to meet strict environmental standards. Residents have to show that they can provide all their own energy and water — or else they could lose their house!

A couple in Wales has wowed viewers of the Channel 4 TV series Grand Designs with their futuristic £150,000 eco-home. But the home comes with a unique twist: live green or lose it!

Green standards

When Abiaail and Marcus Beck stumbled across a secluded spot deep in the beautiful Welsh woodlands, they knew they had found the dream location for their family home.

But there was a catch. To build their dream home, they had to meet the strict environmental rules of Wales' One Planet Development policy, which aims to protect natural areas.

High stakes

Under the policy, they have to submit information about every part of their lives, from how they buy their clothes to what food they eat.

The stakes are high. If they don't meet requirements, Marcus says that they will be

"chucked out" — and their dream home torn down!

Lifestyle choices

But the couple has welcomed the challenge. Marcus designed the house himself, using trees from the forest that were at risk of disease. They will get 35% of their food from a nearby communal garden.

Having completed the development in July, they say they have no regrets. "I remember feeling like 'I am determined to prove you wrong'," says Abigail.
